FoBOS Litter Pick of Bulmershe Field - Report from Mary Bather

FoBOS (Friends of Bulmershe Open Space) volunteers organised a litter pick of Bulmershe Field and surrounds for the morning of Wednesday, 27th August. We were supported by members of EASI and WASP (Woodley's equivalent to EASI) and by local councillors, and managed to clear the field and many of the surrounding roads. Our next events will include a pick of the Bulmershe Park Woodland, which has been heavily littered over the summer, at the end of October, and there will be a leaf sweep and litter pick of the Town Lane public right of way at the end of November. Earley Town Council's Autumn Litter Pick



On Wednesday 8th October, fourteen of Earley Town Council's Wednesday Volunteers took part in their annual autumn litter pick. The pick covered a route starting at The Interpretation Centre in Instow Road, followed the path through the Maiden Erlegh Nature Reserve to Brookside, followed Gipsy Lane to Riverside Park and crossing Rushey Way followed the green corridor to Paddick Drive. Around a dozen bags of litter were collected. Well done to the volunteers, who on most Wednesdays are engaged in helping maintain the nature reserve, but are also experts at litter picking!

Hawkedon Primary School

As part of their Value Enrichment Days, on 6th November Hawkedon Primary School held a 'Kindness in the community day', where the children aged 4-11 had the opportunity to show kindness in the local community; kindness being one of the school's core values. Their litter pick covered both the school grounds and paths close to the school. EASI loaned the litter pickers and provided the collection bags to the school.
